Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead exposure with all women who are planning a pregnancy, pregnant or lactating.
 CDC & ACOG recommend testing when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

 The Alabama Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program encourages universal blood lead testing of ALL children at ages 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.

- CPT Code 36416, Collection of a capillary blood specimen, ~\$3.00
- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$12.00
- Medicaid : ~ \$14.00

State Licensure

CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher

Lead Testing Reporting Requirements

All blood lead results are required to be reported.
