# **Physician Office Lab & Clinical Laboratory**

Defined as: Any facility that conducts on site blood lead analysis in the State of Arizona or on Arizona residents.

#### Licensure

Facility must: Hold a CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher.

#### **Patient Testing**

Facility must: Confirm capillary blood lead test results greater than or equal to 5 µg/dL with a venous sample by a reference lab.

### **Quality Control**

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. Each new lot of test kits.
- 2. Each new shipment of materials even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. Each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

#### Critically Elevated Blood Lead Levels

Facility must: Report results greater than 45 µg/dL for children, and greater than 60 µg/dL for adults within ONE day to the Department.

- 1. Report results greater than or equal to 10 μg/dL and less than 45 μg/dL for children, and 25-60 μg/dL for adults within five business days to the Department electronically or by fax.

  - b. To report by fax:

- 2. Report results less than 10 μg/dL for children and 25 μg/dL for adults at least monthly to the Department by an approved electronic format.
