Clinical Laboratory & Physician Office Laboratory

A clinical laboratory is defined in state and federal law as any place where testing is done on human specimens for diagnostic purposes. A physicians office labroatory (POL) is considered a clinical laboratory if any patient testing is done on-site. (e.g., fingerstick blood tests)

Licensure

Facility must: Be approved as a Clinical Laboratory in California.

- 1. Apply for CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher
- Apply for CA Clinical Laboratory Registration with the state of CA, Laboratory Field Services https://www.cdph.ca.gov/CDPH%20Document%20Library/ControlledForms/lab155.pdf
 - a. Annual application fee applies
 - b. Complete LAB 155 and send form and payment to: CDPH Laboratory Field Services

Facility must: Confirm capillary blood lead test results greater than or equal to 10 µg/dL with a venous sample by a reference lab.

Quality Control

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control samples according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. With each new lot of test kits.
- 2. With each new shipment of materials, even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. With each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

Result Reporting

Reporting Solutions by State: www.LeadCare2.com/reporting

Facility must:

- 1. Report results greater than or equal to 10 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ within 3 working days of analysis.
- 2. Report results less than 10 µg/dL within 30 calendar days of analysis.
- Report all patient blood lead results <u>electronically</u> to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) using the California Electonic Blood Lead Reporting System per CA Health and Safety Code, Section 124130.
 - a. Requires access to a computer with Internet connection
 - b. Review the California Electronic Blood Lead Reporting System: Requirements and Procedures Manual

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Proficiency Testing

NOT REQUIRED, for CLIA-waived labs: Recommended, to monitor the quality of your blood lead testing program.

REQUIRED for moderately / highly complex labs: To access reimbursement through the California Child Health and Disability gram (CHDP) for blood lead analysis you must:

- 1. Enroll in and be rated proficient in the California Blood Lead Proficiency Assurance Program (CBLPAP) see page 2. http://www.cdph.ca.gov/certlic/labs/Pages/CaliforniaBloodLeadProficiencyAssuranceProgram(CBLPAP).aspx
- Enroll in a Proficiency Testing program approved by CMS. We recommend the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene (WSLH) proficiency program. For more information about their program call (800) 462-5261 or go to http://www.slh.wisc.edu/proficiency/
- 3. Maintain an average score of at least 80% on proficiency testing for two of the last three consecutive regulatory proficiency events after initial enrollment in CBLPAP.
