Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead risk exposure as part of the first prenatal visit. Per CDC & ACOG recommendations, test when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

- All children must be screened with a lead test at or around 12 months of age.
- All other children should be screened with the Lead Risk Assessment Questionnaire.
- Proof of lead test required for enrollment in child care or school programs through kindergarten.

What is the reimbursement?*

- CPT Code 36416, Collection of a capillary blood specimen, ~\$3.00
- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$No data available at this time.
- Medicaid : <u>~ \$16.50</u>
