### Who needs to be tested?

#### Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead exposure with all women who are lactating, pregnant, or planning a pregnancy. CDC & ACOG recommend testing when only one risk factor is present.

## **Targeted**

- Screen all children enrolled in Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids at 6 and 9 months with a <u>lead</u> <u>risk assessment questionnaire</u>.
- Test all Medicaid and PeachCare for Kids children with a blood test at 12 and 24 months.
- Test all high-risk children at 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested. High-risk children are identified as:
  - WIC eligible; adopted outside of the US; parent with a high-risk job or hobby; all children residing in the following counties: Bibb Chatham Cobb DeKalb Fulton Glynn Gwinnett Hall Richmond Sumter Thomas Troup
- All other children should be screened with the Lead Risk Assessment Questionnaire.

- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$13.00
- Medicaid Managed Care Plans: ~ \$9.00

CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher

## **Lead Testing Reporting Requirements**

 <u>ALL</u> blood lead results must be reported to the state.
