Requirements for Lead Testing*

Massachusetts

Licensure

Facility must: Hold a CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher.

Patient Testing

Facility must: Confirm capillary blood lead test results greater than or equal to 5 μg/dL with a venous (confirmation testing is recommended within 60 days)..

Quality Control

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. Each new lot of test kits.
- 2. Each new shipment of materials even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. Each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

Critically Elevated Blood Lead Levels

For poisoned results of 10 μg/dL or greater: In addition to regular electronic reporting (within 3 working days of analysis), send a separate report to Sharon Gifford at sharon.gifford@massmail.state.ma.us; (978) 851-7261 x4031.

Result Reporting

Facility must:

- Report ALL childhood blood lead test results to the MA Department of Public Health Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPPP)
 - a. All test results less than 10 μ g/dL must be reported to CLPPP within ONE WEEK of analysis
 - b. All test results 10 μ g/dL or greater must be reported to CLPPP within 3 working days of analysis
- 2. Report ALL test results electronically via the Mass HIway Statewide Health Information Exchange
 - a. You can use the FREE LeadCare data entry software to create your data text files. Go to www.leadcare2.com/reporting to download the data entry software. Proficiency Testing

Recommended: To comply with the Massachusetts Department of Public Health standards for blood lead testing, Magellan Diagnostics recommends that all facilities performing blood lead tests on Massachusetts residents participate in an approved Proficiency Testing (PT) program to monitor the quality of your blood lead testing program.
