Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal and Maine lawrequire blood lead testing of all children covered by MaineCare (Medicaid) at ages 1 and 2 years old and at ages
 3 to 6 years old if they have not been previously tested.
- Maine law requires blood lead testing of all children not covered by MaineCare (Medicaid) at ages one and two years old
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead risk exposure as part of the first prenatal visit. Per CDC & ACOG recommendations, test when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

Maine Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Unit recommends testing all children 3-5 years (36-72 months) yearly unless the risk assessment questionnaire is negative.

- Testing for lead should also be considered, regardless of age,in:
 - Children diagnosed with pica, developmental delays, behavioral problems, or ADHD.
 - Children presenting with unexplained illness such as severe anemia, lethargy, or abdominal pain.
 - Ingestion of paint chip or object that might contain lead.
- Test refugee children 6 months to 16 years upon entry to the U.S. with follow up testing in 3-6 months for children 6 months to 6 years old.

- CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher
- Approval by Maine Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Unit
