### Licensure

### **Quality Control**

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. Each new lot of test kits.
- 2. Each new shipment of materials even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. Each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

#### **Critically Elevated Blood Lead Levels**

*Facility must:* Report blood lead levels of greater than or equal to 45 µg/dL in any person to the Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services (MO DHSS) within one (1) calendar day from the date of analysis by telephone, fax, or other rapid communication.

#### **Result Reporting**

#### Facility must:

- Report blood lead results less than 45 μg/dL to in any person to the MO DHSS within three (3) calendar days from the date of analysis.
