# Licensure

Facility must: Hold a Federal CLIA Certificate of Waiver or higher

- 1. Complete the application for a CLIA Certificate of Waiver (http://www.cms.hhs.gov/cmsforms/downloads/cms116.pdf)
- 2. Apply for PA clinical laboratory license with the Bureau of Laboratories (if not already licensed)
  - a. Complete Permit Application from Pennsylvania Department of Health. http://www.portal.state.pa.us/portal/server.pt?open=514&objlD=556786&mode=2
  - b. Application requires a letter of attestation, Laboratory Personnel Qualification Appraisal forms for personnel engaged in BL analysis, and a copy of the BL protocol.
  - c. Initial application fee is \$100. The annual licensure fees vary on the testing performed.

#### **Patient Testing**

Training Tools: www.LeadCare2.com/training

Facility must: Test all specimens within 5 days of collection.

Capillary blood lead test results ≥5 µg/dL should be confirmed with a venous sample tested by a reference lab.

# **Quality Control**

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. Each new lot of test kits.
- 2. Each new shipment of materials even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. Each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

## **Result Reporting**

Facility must: Report ALL blood lead results the PA Department of Public Health per PA code Chapter 27 section 27.34, within one (1) day of analysis.

- 1. Contact PA Department of Health, Bureau of Information Technology
- 2. ≥ 100 BL tests/month mandates electronic reporting via PA-NEDSS Call Vivian Books, PA Dept. of Health, Bureau of Information Technology (BIT) Ph: (717) 783-9171. Please ask for the PA-NEDSS help desk.
- < 100 BL tests/month can utilize the hard copy reporting form and manual entry into PA-NEDSS. Reports may also be faxed.</li>

## **Proficiency Testing**

Required: To maintain:

- 1. Enroll in Bureau of Laboratories, PA Blood Lead Proficiency Testing Program. (\$350/yr)
- 2. Maintain an average score of at least 80% on proficiency testing for the last two consecutive regulatory events

Note: Head Start programs are exempt from PT
