Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead exposure with all women who are lactating, pregnant, or planning a pregnancy. CDC & ACOG recommend testing when only one risk factor is present.

Targeted

- TX CLPPP recommends testing all children in "targeted area" for lead at age 12 and 24 months and any age after 12 months up to 6 years if never tested. Targeted areas represent 65% of all zip codes in TX.

- Offer all pregnant women anticipatory guidance including a risk assessement questionnaire.

- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$9.00
- Medicaid (Texas Health Steps): ~ \$13.98
 - Effective 12/1/11: "Blood lead testing (procedure code 83655) may be reimbursed to Texas Health Steps medical providers when it is performed in the provider's office using point-of-care testing." Ref: TX Medicaid Provider News Archive, posted Oct. 28, 2011.
