Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- A lead test is required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead exposure with all women who are planning a pregnancy, pregnant or lactating.
 CDC & ACOG recommendation testing when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

- All children who live in a targeted zip code should have at least one venous or capillary blood lead test at one and two years of age, and children 36-72 months of age who have not been screened previously. Please see high risk zip code list on Page 2 of this document.
- All children who reside outside a targeted zip code who live in pre-1978 housing, should have at least one blood lead test between the ages of 12 and 24 months and children 25-72 months of age should have a blood lead test if the child has not been previously screened.
- To determine if a child is at risk of lead poisoning the child's health care provider should use the basic-risk questionnaire found here: http://epht.health.utah.gov/epht-view/pdf/epht/resource/ChildLeadRisk.pdf
