Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old, and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead risk exposure as part of the first prenatal visit. Per CDC & ACOG recommendations, test when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

- Vermont law requires that <u>all children</u> are tested for lead at 12 months and 24 months.
- For children of refugees: perform a lead test on all children of refugees, age 6 months to 16 years old, upon entry to the U.S. Within 3 to 6 months, a follow-up blood lead test should be conducted on all refugee children age 6 months to 6 years, regardless of initial screening result.

- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$20.00
- Medicaid : <u>~ \$16.00</u>
