## **Quality Control**

Facility must: Run two levels of Quality Control according to the manufacturer's instructions, which are:

- 1. Each new lot of test kits.
- 2. Each new shipment of materials even if it's the same lot previously received.
- 3. Each new operator (i.e. operator who has not performed the test recently).
- 4. Monthly, as a check on continued storage conditions.
- 5. When problems (storage, operator, instrument, or other) are suspected or identified.
- 6. If otherwise required by your laboratory's standard QC procedures.

### **Result Reporting**

Facility must: Report ALL blood lead test (venous and capillary) results within 7 days of detection, regardless of result.

- 1. Report using an electronic format approved by the Department. For more information, please refer to: http://www.sos.ne.gov/rules-and-regs/regsearch/Rules/Health and Human Services System/Title-173/Chapter-01.pdf
- 2. Report the following information: The date of sample collection and analysis; whether the sample is a capillary or venous blood sample; the date of birth, address, and sex of the patient; the name and address of the physician; and the race and ethnicity of the patient, if known.
